#### **Harvest Specifications**

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Harvest type: clearcut with reserves.

### Harvest and Reserves

Harvest: cut all aspen, ash, and balm; balsam fir 8" and over, and excess birch stems.

Reserve: balsam under 8", all maple, spruce, and oak. Retain well-formed birch spaced 100' where no other reserves exist.

Reserve all non-hazardous snags.

Trees marked with "R" are to be reserved for wildlife.

## Access

Gates must remain locked during hunting season.

Gravel pit road must be used to access the timber sale. Access road must be kept in good condition, as determined by administering forester, at all times. Equipment operation and/or log landing will not be allowed on the road.

#### Landings and Access Roads

Location and construction of new landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator.

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed.

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# Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Do not damage reserve trees.

Do not disturb survey markers, including witness trees, which have been painted orange.

Sale boundaries painted with orange lines (I I I); ownership boundaries painted with orange circles (O O O). Natural boundaries are also used; see sale map.

### Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50' of all wetlands.

# **Slash Disposal**

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.

Slash height must not exceed 3 ft. within view of road.

### **Regeneration Plan**

Natural aspen regeneration.


