### Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

On thins, timber must be processed at the stump.

On small clearcut, full tree/whole tree skidding required across harvest area, slash piled, but leaving 20% slash scattered across sale area.

On thins, cut 12 ft. access strips reserving 40 ft. in between strips for thinning. Thin stand down to an average of 90 basal area. Favor the removal of smaller diameter, poor quality, and damaged trees. This will generally require harvesting jack pine before red pine and balsam before jack pine.

Sale has orange painted sale lines and also uses natural cutting boundaries.

Do not fell timber across sale boundaries.

Do not disturb survey markers, including witness trees.

### Slash Disposal

A 10 ft. wide slash free zone must be maintained along roads and trails.

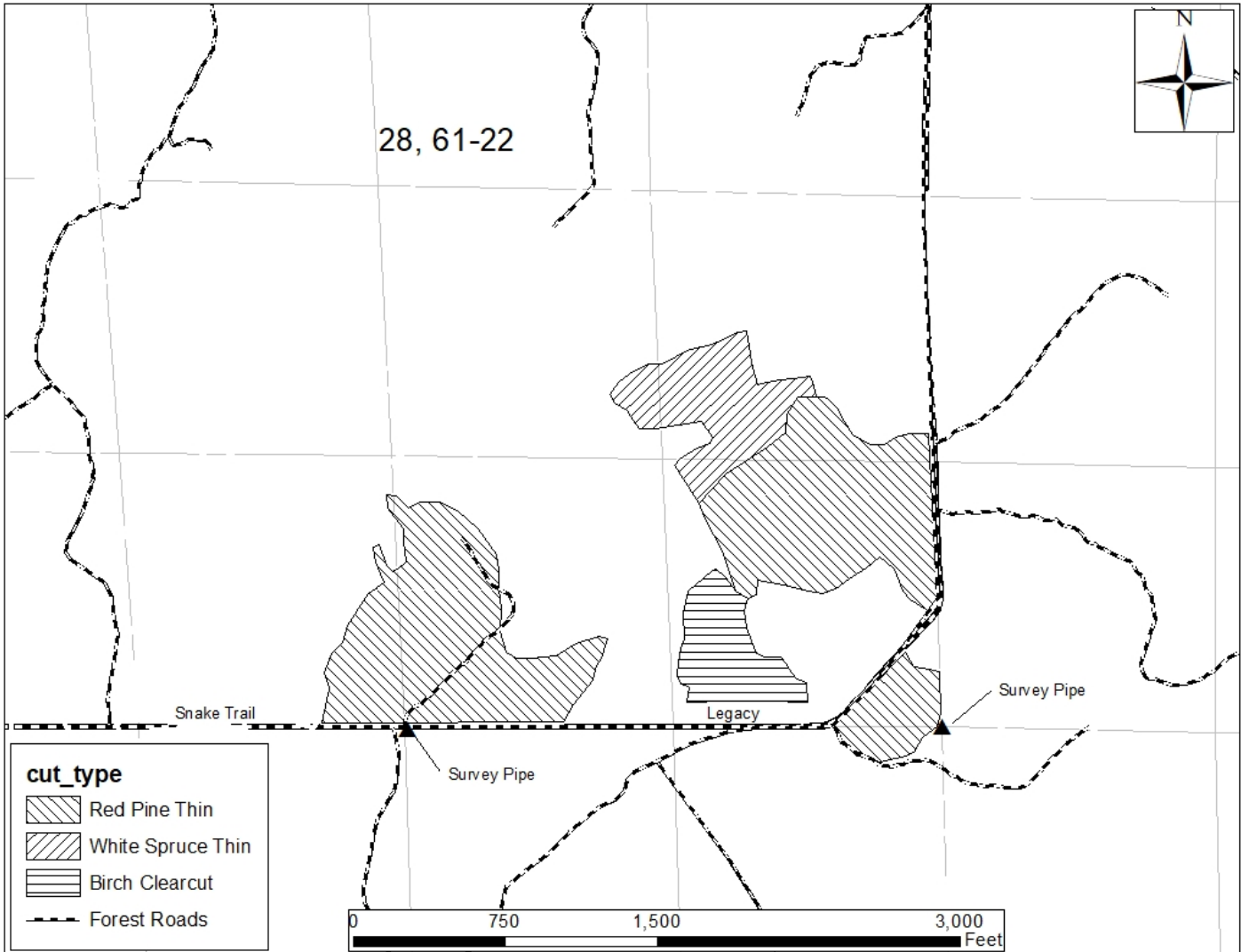
### Special Conditions

Utilize all trees with at least 2 sticks up to a 3" top in thins.
