Harvest Specifications

Comments
Harvest Type = Aspen clear-cut with reserves.

Harvest and Reserves
Reserve all non-hazardous snags.

Access
Sale immediately east of and adjacent to Will Paul Road (a public road).

Landings and Access Roads
Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator. Trails and landings need to be rehabilitated to a satisfactory condition, determined by administering forester, before performance bond is returned. Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed.

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Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Do not fell timber into wetlands or across sale boundaries.

Cut all aspen, ash, paper birch, balm of Gilead, and jack pine. Do not cut any other tree species or reserve trees marked with a blue "R". Leave as much advanced regeneration as possible.

The property boundary is painted with 3 orange circles (oOo); where trees are too small for paint, pink ribbons denote the property boundary. The cutting boundary is painted with 3 orange dashes (III). Legacy patches, not to be cut, are painted with 3 blue dashes (III); "END" is written at the start and end of each legacy patch.

Cut up to the beaver felled trees in the NE corner of the sale between the two legacy patches. Leave the beaver felled trees on site.

Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50' of all wetlands.

Slash Disposal

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.

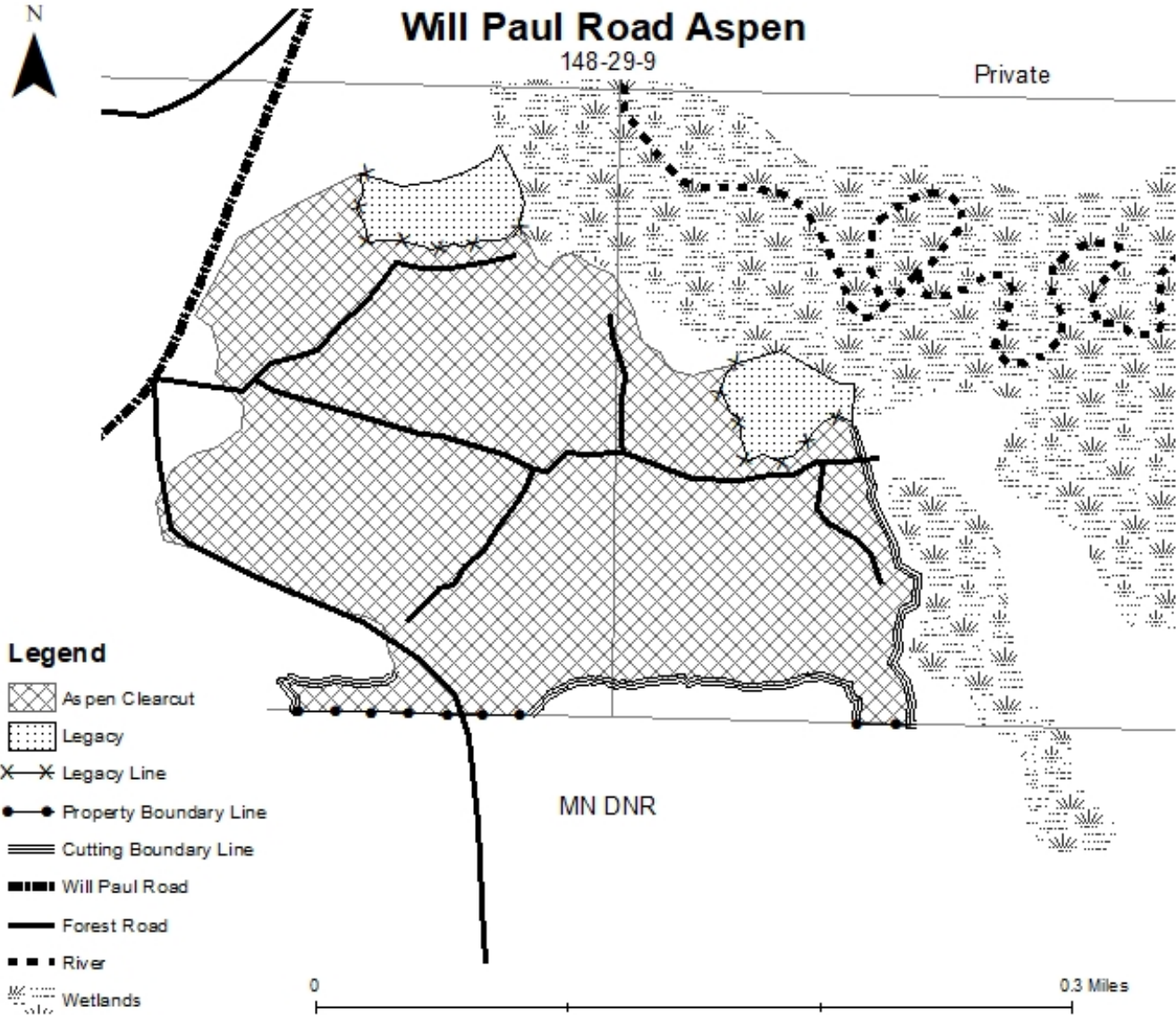
Regeneration Plan
