Harvest type: clearcut with reserves.

Northwest boundary grades to peat aspen/cedar and will need to be dry for acess; the remainder is sandy.

Harvest and Reserves

Reserve all non-hazardous snags.

Harvest: Cut all non-painted timber.

Reserve: all reserve trees have been painted with orange "R--R" marks.

Access

3.9 miles to public road Co Rd 541.

Landings and Access Roads

Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator.

No skidding or equipment operation will be allowed on either existing roads.

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed.

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Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Do not damage reserve trees, which have been painted with orange "R--R" marks.

Do not fell timber across sale boundaries.

Do not disturb survey markers, including witness trees, which have been painted orange.

Sale boundaries painted with orange lines (III), ownership boundaries painted with orange circles (O O O). Natural boundaries are also used; see sale map.

Slash Disposal

Slash may be evenly spread across harvest area or piled at administrator approved locations. 20% of tops and limbs must be scattered throughout the permit area per Site Level Forest Management Guideline. The 20% is in addition to incidental breakage.

Special Conditions

Logging season may be restricted to August through February during high bark beetle risk. All cut pine must be hauled within 3 weeks during June through August.

Regeneration Plan

Site is to be planted with red pine.

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
