**Harvest Specifications**

<u>Comments</u>
Harvest type: aspen clearcut with reserves (10 ac) and black ash thin (1 ac).

<u>Harvest and Reserves</u>
Reserve all non-hazardous snags and den trees. Reserve trees painted with a blue "R". In the aspen stand, cut all aspen, balm of Gilead and black ash. Leave unmerchantable trees. In the black ash stand, thin to a 50 BA. Cut all aspen and balm of Gilead first and then cut the largest ash to 50 BA.

<u>Access</u>
Snowmobile trail regulations in Itasca County Forest Management Guideline & Specifications apply. A minimum of 2 inches of compacted snow must remain on the trail as a running surface. "Caution Truck Hauling" signs will be placed along the trail to alert recreational users. State land must be crossed to access timber sale. Logger must obtain permits/permission from the state. 0.3 miles to County Road 89.

<u>Landings and Access Roads</u>
Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator. Trails and landings need to be rehabilitated to a satisfactory condition, determined by administering forester, before performance bond is returned.

<u>Cutting, Felling, and Skidding</u>
Do not fell timber across sale boundaries. Harvest boundaries are painted with 3 orange dashes (III) or are natural boundaries. Property boundaries are painted with 3 orange circles (o0o).

<u>Slash Disposal</u>
Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area. A 10 ft. wide slash free zone must be maintained along roads and trails.

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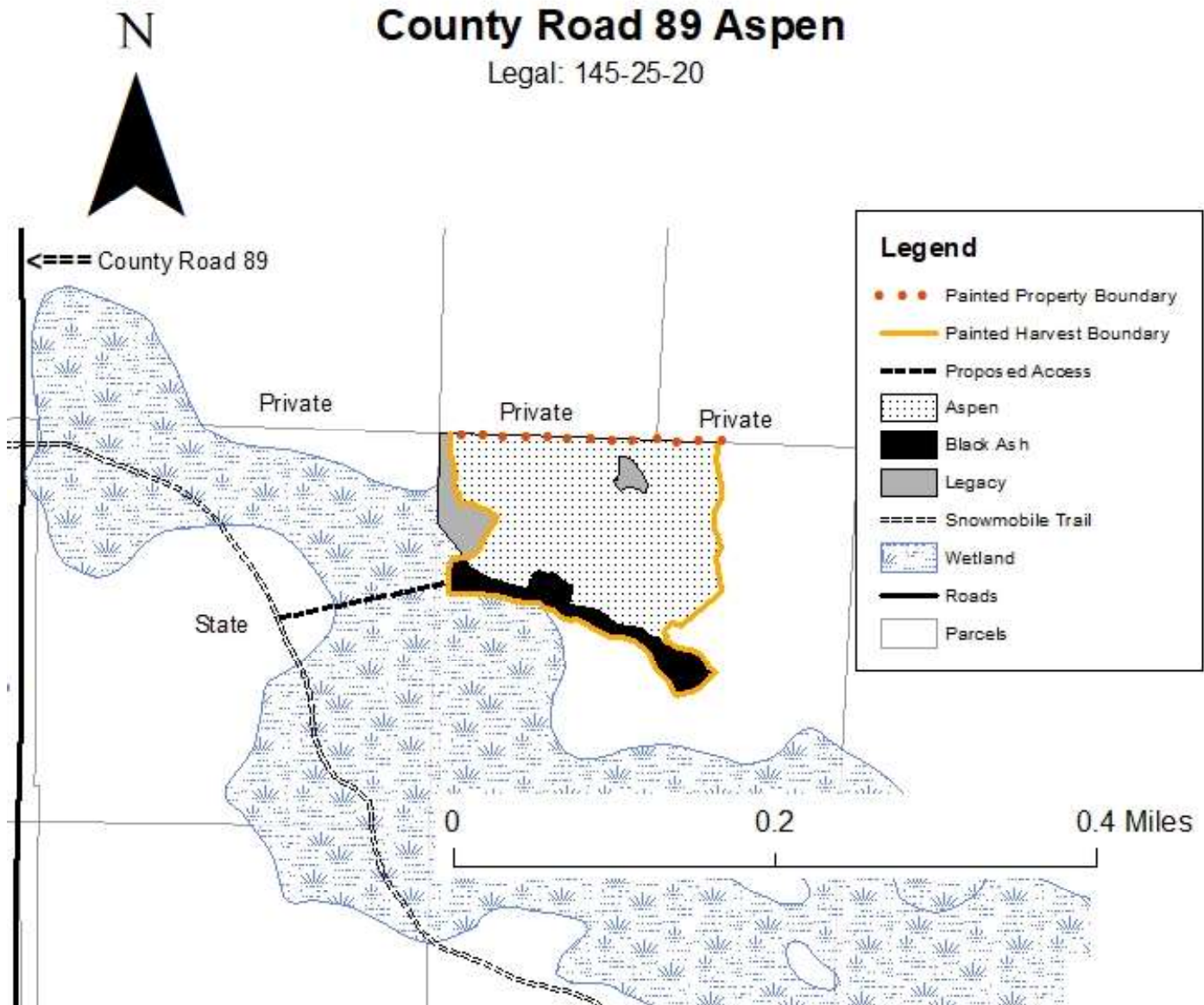
