Harvest and Reserves

Cut all Ash within 30 feet of any harvested Aspen.

Reserve: Bur Oak, Basswood, Birch, Spruce, & Balsam Fir < 2 sticks

Access

Sale is located on County Road 72.

Landings and Access Roads

Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator.

Trails and landings need to be rehabilitated to a satisfactory condition, determined by administering forester, before performance bond is returned.

Landings must be kept back at least 100' from CR 72.

Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

NO full tree/whole tree skidding within Ash Thin.

Do not damage unmarked trees, regeneration, or reserve trees.

ASH THIN: Cut 12 ft. access strips reserving 40 ft. in between strips for thinning. Thin stand down to an average of 50 basal area. Thin from above and remove largest diameter and damaged trees.

West cutting boundary painted Blue Slashes (III). South property boundary painted Orange Circles (oOo). North property boundary painted Blue Circles (oOo). Natural boundary on the east cutting boundary along CR 72/powerline.

Slash Disposal

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area and slash height must not exceed 3 ft. within view of road.

Natural Regeneration of Aspen, Ash, Maple, & Balsam.


