Harvest Specifications

Harvest Type
Harvest Type = Marked Hardwood Thin

Cutting, Felling, and Skidding
NO full tree/whole tree skidding across harvest area. Cut trees marked with orange paint. Cut as much ironwood as possible. Sale boundaries painted Orange Slashes (III) or Natural, and property boundaries painted Orange Circles (oOo). Do not damage unmarked trees, regeneration, or reserve trees.

Access
Sale is located on public road County Road 74. A temporary approach needs to be constructed.

Landings and Access Roads
Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator. Trails and landings need to be rehabilitated to a satisfactory condition, determined by administering forester, before performance bond is returned. Landings must be kept back at least 100 feet from CR 74.

Slash Disposal
Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area. Slash height must not exceed 3 feet within view of road.

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Due to nature of managed species and type of harvest little to no tree regeneration is expected to occur after harvest.

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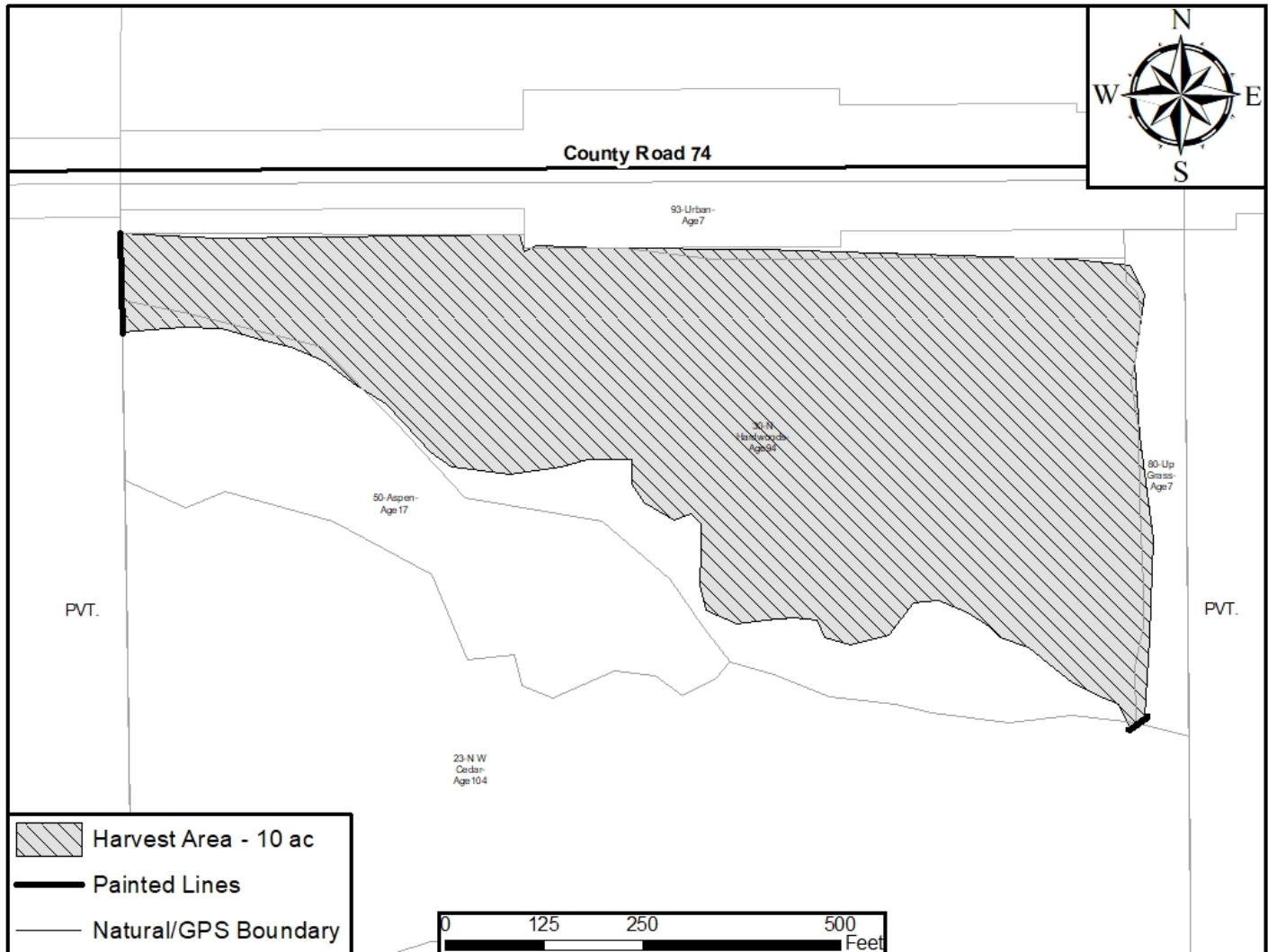
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Site Map:
