Harvest type: Operator select second time red pine thin (21.9 ac) and first time jack pine thin (17.6 ac).

Harvest and Reserves

In jack pine, cut 12 ft. access strips reserving 40 ft. in between strips for thinning. Thin stand down to an average of 80 basal area. Favor the removal of smaller diameter, poor quality, and damaged trees. Some places will only need lanes cut.

In red pine, use existing access lanes to thin the stand to an average of 90-100 BA. Some areas were overthinned before and will require little to no removal.

Access

Easement road crossing private land must be used to access the timber sale. Access road must be kept in good condition, as determined by administering forester, at all times.

It is the permit holder's responsibility to obtain approval from and work with DNR/MNDOT managers before opening access road through gravel pit to the permit area.

0.3 miles to public road County Road 541.

Landings and Access Roads

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed.

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Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Timber must be processed at the stump.

Do not fell timber across sale boundaries.

Slash Disposal

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.

Special Conditions

Logging season may be restricted to August through February during high bark beetle risk. All cut pine must be hauled within 3 weeks during June through August.


