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Landings and Access Roads

Location and construction of any new landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator.

No new road construction will be permitted.

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed.

Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Timber must be processed at the stump.

Do not damage reserve trees.

Sale boundaries painted with orange lines (I I I). Ownership boundaries painted with orange circles (O O O). Natural boundaries are also used; see sale map.

Red pine discovered with embedded nails are painted with orange "up arrows". Cut high with caution and leave trunk as a snag.

Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50' of all wetlands. Reserve all non-merchantable timber within 15ft of all wetlands.

Slash Disposal

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area. Slash height must not exceed 3 ft. within view of road.

Special Conditions

Logging season may be restricted to August through February during high bark beetle risk. All cut pine must be hauled within 3 weeks during June through August.

Regeneration Plan


Natural regeneration in openings created by mature birch removal, otherwise no regeneration is expected within thinned pine.
