Harvest Type: aspen clearcut with reserves.

Harvest and Reserves

Aspen clear-cut, cut all stems >2", reserve all non-hazardous snags, den trees, red pine, and oak.

Access

State land must be crossed to access timber sale. Logger must obtain permits/permission from state.

0.2 miles to County Road 345.

Snowmobile trail regulations in Itasca County Forest Management Guideline & Specifications apply. A minimum of two inches of compacted snow must remain on the trail as a running surface.

Landings and Access Roads

Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator.

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed. Trails and landings need to be rehabilitated to a satisfactory condition, determined by administering forester, before performance bond is returned.

Landings must be kept back at least 100' from County Road 345 and must not be in powerline row.

Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Harvest boundaries are painted with 3 orange dashes. Property boundaries are painted with 3 orange circles or 1 orange dash with/without ribbon. Natural boundaries also exist on the sale.

Cut stems greater than 2" at DBH. Cut fir greater than 2 sticks. Cut tamarack along sale edge within reach of machinery from dry ground.

Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50' of all wetlands.

Slash Disposal

A 10 ft. wide slash free zone must be maintained along roads and trails.

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.

Regeneration Plan

Natural regeneration to aspen.


