Harvest Type: 2nd (21 acres) and 3rd (22 acres) time red pine thin operator select.

Harvest and Reserves

Comments

Reserve all non-hazardous snags, den trees, white pine, white spruce, paper birch outside aspen clearcut, and orange "R" painted reserve trees.

Access

In the northern most blocks, ATV riders will be rerouted. Truck hauling and detour signs will be placed along the ATV route. Southern 3 blocks adjacent to Wolf Lake Trail. Northern 2 blocks 0.1 miles from Wolf Lake Trail.

Landings and Access Roads

Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator.

Trails and landings need to be rehabilitated to a satisfactory condition, determined by administering forester, before performance bond is returned.

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed. Landings must be kept back at least 100' from Wolf Lake Trail.

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Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Do not damage reserve trees.

Harvest boundaries are painted with vertical oranges dashes; rest of boundaries are natural. Target removal of overtopping aspen and jack pine as well as suppressed, forked, or poor quality red pine. Thin to a 90 BA. Northern most stand, clearcut aspen and paper birch inside the aspen paint lines (3 orange horizontal dashes). Timber must be processed at the stump.

Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50' of all wetlands.

Slash Disposal

A 10 ft. wide slash free zone must be maintained along roads and trails.

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.


Special Conditions

Logging season may be restricted to August through February during high bark beetle risk. All cut pine must be hauled within 3 weeks during June through August.
