Harvest Type: aspen clearcut with reserves (19 acres); 1st time jack pine operator select thin (3 acres).

Harvest and Reserves

Reserve all non-hazardous snags, den trees, reserve trees painted with a blue "R", maple, birch, oak, white pine, ash, and elm.

Access

Most of sale is adjacent to County Road 53; northern most block is 0.25 miles from County Road 53

Landings and Access Roads

Trails and landings need to be rehabilitated to a satisfactory condition, determined by administering forester, before performance bond is returned.

Reserve all non-merchantable timber within 15 feet of all roads.

Landings must be kept back at least 100 feet from County Road 53.

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed.

Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator.

Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Do not fell timber into wetlands or across sale boundaries.

Jack pine stand, cut 12 foot access strips reserving 40 feet in between strips for thinning. Thin stand down to an average of 90 basal area. First cut aspen, second jack pine, and then red pine. Favor the removal of smaller diameter, poor quality, and damaged trees..

Harvest boundaries painted with 3 or 1 blue dash. 3 horizontal orange strips denote boundary between thin and clearcut; rest are natural boundaries.

Aspen stand, cut merchantable aspen, jack pine, spruce, fir, and only red pine marked with a blue "C".

Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50 feet of all wetlands.

Reserve all non-merchantable timber within 15 feet of all wetlands.

Slash Disposal

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.

A 10 foot wide slash free zone must be maintained along roads and trails.

Slash height must not exceed 3 feet within view of County Road 53.

Special Conditions

Logging season may be restricted to August through February during high bark beetle risk. All cut pine must be hauled within 3 weeks during June through August.

Regeneration Plan

Natural regeneration via clearcutting for aspen and thinning will convert jack pine stand into red pine stand.


