Harvest Type: 2nd time red pine thin (11 acres); 1st time white spruce thin (25 acres). Both operator select.

Harvest and Reserves

Reserve all non-hazardous snags, den trees, red maple, elm, oak, ash, and white pine.

Access

State land must be crossed to access timber sale. Logger must obtain permits/permission from state.

1.2 miles to white spruce from Scenic Highway 7. 1.8 miles to red pine from Scenic Highway 7.

Landings and Access Roads

Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator.

Trails and landings need to be rehabilitated to a satisfactory condition, determined by administering forester, before performance bond is

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed.

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Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Timber must be processed at the stump.

Red pine stand, cut 12 foot access strips reserving 40 feet in between strips for thinning. Thin stand down to an average of 90 basal area. Cut overtopping aspen, paper birch, balm of Gilead, and fir within 10 feet of any pine or spruce. Favor the removal of smaller diameter, poor quality, and damaged trees.

White spruce stand, thin stand down to an average of 90 basal area. Cut overtopping aspen, paper birch, balm of Gilead, and fir within 10 feet of any pine or spruce. Favor the removal of white spruce over red pine as well as smaller diameter, poor quality, and damaged trees.

Harvest boundaries painted with 3 or 1 orange dash. Property boundary painted with 3 orange circles. Rest are natural boundaries.

Do not disturb survey markers, including witness trees.

Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50 feet of all wetlands.

Reserve all non-merchantable timber within 15 feet of all wetlands.

Slash Disposal

A 10 foot wide slash free zone must be maintained along roads and trails.

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.

Special Conditions

Logging season may be restricted to August through February during high bark beetle risk. All cut pine must be hauled within 3 weeks during June through August.

Regeneration Plan

Due to nature of managed species and type of harvest little to no tree regeneration is expected to occur after harvest.


