### Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Do not fell timber into wetlands or across sale boundaries.

Property boundary painted with 3 orange circles, harvest boundary painted with 3 or 1 orange dash, thin/clearcut boundary painted with 3 blue dots, and rest are natural boundaries.

Aspen stands, clearcut all merchantable aspen, paper birch, and fir.

Spruce and red pine stands, thin down to an average of 90 basal area. Within 10 feet of any spruce or red pine, cut overtopping aspen, fir, balm of Gilead, and paper birch. Favor the removal of smaller diameter, poor quality, and damaged trees.

### Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50 feet of all wetlands.

Reserve all non-merchantable timber within 15 feet of all wetlands.

### Slash Disposal

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.

A 10 foot wide slash free zone must be maintained along roads and trails.

### Special Conditions

Logging season may be restricted to August through February during high bark beetle risk. All cut pine must be hauled within 3 weeks during June through August.


### Regeneration Plan

Natural regeneration in aspen stands; thinning in spruce/pine stands will increase residual growth.
