Harvest Type: Aspen Clearcuts w/reserves 30 ac, Second Entry Red Pine Thin (operator select) 6 ac, Ash Thin 4.5 ac

Harvest and Reserves

Reserve all non-hazardous snags and cavity trees or any trees marked with an "R". In aspen clearcuts, also reserve cedar, yellow birch and pine.

10 acre aspen stand to SE could be logged during dry summer conditions (map), remainder of harvest requires winter frozen ground.

Access

Private road must be used to access the timber sale. Access road must be kept in good condition, as determined by administering forester, at all times.

2.4 miles to Turtle Creek Road.

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Landings and Access Roads

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed. Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator.

Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

The second entry red pine thin requires timber to be processed at the stump. Use existing access strips and thin stand down to an average of 100 basal area. Favor the removal of smaller diameter, poor quality, and damaged trees. On ash thin, harvest ash >8" dbh. Sale has both orange painted and natural cutting boundaries.

Do not disturb survey markers, including witness trees.

Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50' of all wetlands.

Slash Disposal

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.

A 10 ft. wide slash free zone must be maintained along roads and trails.

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
