Harvest Type: Marked hardwood thin (27.8 acres) and Clearcut w/reserves (9.1 acres)

Harvest and Reserves

Marked Hardwood Thin: Cut all aspen and orange ringed hardwood species within the permit boundaries. Reserve all non-marked/non-aspen species.

Clearcut w/reserves: Cut all aspen species. Reserve all Maple, Birch, Basswood, Spruce, Balsam, Oak species, Elm and pine species.

Reserve all non-hazardous snags.

Trees marked with "R" are to be reserved for wildlife.

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Access

Gate must be locked at all times, except on days when 3 or more loads are hauled.

Gates must remain locked during hunting season.

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Landings and Access Roads

Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator.

Trails and landings need to be rehabilitated to a satisfactory condition, determined by administering forester, before performance bond is returned.

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed.

Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Timber must be processed at the stump.

Do not damage unmarked trees, regeneration, or reserve trees.

Do not fell timber into wetlands or across sale boundaries.

Sale boundaries painted with orange vertical lines (harvest boundary) or 3 orange circles (property boundary).

Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50' of all wetlands. Residual trees maintain greater than 60 sqft/acre within known filter strip locations.

Roads and skid trails must be stabilized. This may involve installing water bars, strike outs, and/or mulching and seeding.

Slash Disposal

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.

Regeneration Plan

Natural Regeneration by way of coppice, stump sprouts and seed of residual stand.


