### **Harvest Guidelines**

Harvest Type: Tamarack Clear Cut (52.3 ac) and Ash Thin (7.8 ac).

#### **Reserve Guidelines**

Reserve all non-hazardous snags.

Reserve all: cedar, white pine, oak, elm, balm, and balsam < 2 sticks.

In Tamarack clear cut area, reserve all regeneration along with one health tamarack seed tree every 60 feet.

#### Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Sale boundaries painted in ORANGE slash (III) along with natural boundaries.

Ash Thin: cut 12 foot access strips reserving 40 feet in between strips for thinning. Thin stand down to an average of 50 basal area. Favor the removal of larger diameter & good quality trees first. The harvestable species in this area are: ash, balsam, black spruce, paper birch, and tamarack.

## Access

Access is along County Rd 428.

## Slash Disposal

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area. Slash height must not exceed 3 feet within view of road.

## Comments

As of site visit: Average basal area in ash thin area is 75 BA. In tamarack area, roughly 60% of the stand is in decline due to bark beetles.


