Harvest Specifications

Harvest Guidelines

Harvest Type: Red pine clearcut with reserves (11 acres), paper birch clearcut with reserves (1 acre), and aspen clearcut with reserves (1 acre).

Reserve Guidelines

Reserve all non-hazardous snags, den trees, cavity trees, white pine without blue "C", oak, and blue "R" reserves trees. East of prescription line, reserve red pine 5" DBH and less.

Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Do not fell timber into wetlands or across sale boundaries.

Property boundaries painted with 3 orange circles. Harvest boundaries painted with 3 or 1 vertical orange dash. Prescription boundary painted with 4 blue "+" marks. Rest are natural boundaries.

Cut red pine, aspen, jack pine, paper birch, spruce, fir, and maple. Cut white pine with blue "C".

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Access

Snowmobile trail regulations in Itasca County Forest Management Guideline & Specifications apply. A minimum of two inches of compacted snow must remain on the trail as a running surface.

Access is along County Roads 53 and 336.

Landings and Access Roads

Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator.

Trails and landings need to be rehabilitated to a satisfactory condition, determined by administering forester, before performance bond is returned.

Reserve all non-merchantable timber within 15 feet of county roads.

Landings must be kept back at least 100 feet from county roads.

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed.

Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50 feet of all wetlands.

Can cross intermittent creek in 1 location. All slash must be pulled from the creek and banks rehabilitated upon sale completion.

Reserve all non-merchantable timber within 15 feet of all wetlands.

Slash Disposal

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.

A 10 foot wide slash free zone must be maintained along roads and trails.

Slash height must not exceed 3 feet within view of county roads.

Special Conditions

Logging season may be restricted to August through February during high bark beetle risk. All cut pine must be hauled within 3 weeks during June through August.

Regeneration Plan

Artificial red pine regeneration in 75% of the sale area. Natural regeneration in the rest of the area.


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Site Map:
