Harvest Guidelines					
Harvest Type: aspen clearcut with reserves (20 acres) and tamarack clearcut with reserves (24 acres).					
Reserve Guidelines					
Reserve all non-hazardous snags, den trees, cavity trees, orange "R" trees, elm, white spruce, oak, basswood, pine, cedar, and yellow birch.					
Cutting, Felling, and Skidding					
Do not fell non-wetland timber into wetlands or any timber across sale boundaries.					
Harvest boundaries painted with 3 orange dashes. Property boundaries painted with 3 orange circles. Rest are natural boundaries. Cut merchantable aspen and tamarack. In aspen, also cut 3 stick and greater birch, ash, fir, and maple. In tamarack, also cut 3 stick and

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Access

Private and state land must be crossed to access tamarack. Logger must obtain permits/permission from land owners. Private road must be used to access tamarack. Access road must be kept in good condition, as determined by administering forester, at all times.

1.5 miles from aspen to Scenic Highway 7, and 1.1 miles from Lum Lake Road to tamarack.

B&B Connection ATV Trail must be used to access aspen and kept in good condition, as determined by administering forester, at all times. "Caution Logging" signs must be placed along trail to alert users.

Landings and Access Roads

Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator. Trails and landings need to be rehabilitated to a satisfactory condition, determined by administering forester, before performance bond is returned.

Roads and landings must be approved by sale administrator.

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed.

Site, Soil, and Water Protection

In aspen, filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50 feet of all wetlands. Roads and skid trails must be stabilized. This may involve installing water bars, strike outs, and/or mulching and seeding.

Slash Disposal

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.

A 10 foot wide slash free zone must be maintained along roads and trails.


Natural regeneration of aspen. Aerially seed black spruce in tamarack sale area.
