Harvest Type: Shelterwood (Leave tree marking)
Harvest all stems not marked with blue Paint

Reserve Guidelines

Reserve all yellow birch, balsam fir and pine species.

Trees marked with "R" are to be reserved for wildlife.

Reserve all non-hazardous snags, den trees and cavity trees.

Cutting, Felling, and Skidding

Do not damage reserve trees.

Do not fell timber into wetlands or across sale boundaries.

Sale boundaries are painted in orange paint. Natural boundaries (no paint) are also used on this permit.

Access

Gate must be locked at all times, except on days when 3 or more loads are hauled.

Gates must remain locked during hunting season.

Access is along public roadways.

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Landings and Access Roads

Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator.

Trails and landings need to be rehabilitated to a satisfactory condition, determined by administering forester, before performance bond is returned.

Berm(s) must be installed after sale is completed.

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed.

Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Roads and skid trails must be stabilized. This may involve installing water bars, strike outs, and/or mulching and seeding.

Slash Disposal

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.


