Harvest Guidelines
Harvest Type: Aspen clearcut w/reserves (23.1 acres)
Cut all aspen within this harvest type.
Harvest Type: Spruce clearcut w/reserves (6.3 acres) & Tamarack clearcut w/reserves (15.1 acres)
Cut all spruce and tamarack within tis harvest type.
All black spruce greater than 5ft. must be severed. Mistle toe prevention
Reserve Guidelines
Reserve all pine (red & white), oak (red & bur), birch (paper & yellow), basswood, balsam and elm.
Trees marked with "R" are to be reserved for wildlife.
Reserve all non-hazardous snags.
Cutting, Felling, and Skidding
Do not damage reserve trees.
Do not fell timber into wetlands or across sale boundaries.
Sale boundaries are painted with orange paint. Natural boundaries, without paint, are used on this permit.

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Access

Access is along public roadways.

Landings and Access Roads

Location and construction of any new roads/landings must be pre-approved by the sale administrator.

Trails and landings need to be rehabilitated to a satisfactory condition, determined by administering forester, before performance bond is returned.

Temporary water/wetland crossing needed on one or more locations. Remove crossing when harvesting activity is completed.

Berm(s) must be installed after sale is completed.

Timber sale administrator shall be notified at least 3 working days prior to completion of hauling and road work. This provides adequate time for permit area inspection and addressing of permit compliance requirements before hauling and road work equipment is removed.

Site, Soil, and Water Protection

Filter strips require <5% soil disturbance within 50 feet of all wetlands.

Can cross intermittent creek / drainage in 1 location. All slash must be pulled from the creek and banks rehabilitated upon sale completion.

Slash Disposal

Slash must be evenly distributed throughout permit area.


Regeneration Plan

Regeneration of aspen will be achieved with aspen coppice and by way of seed from reserve species. Tamarack and spruce area will be aerial seeded after harvest operations to ensure full stocking.
